At a Meeting of Ashdon Parish Council held on Monday 9th January 2023 in the Baptist Schoolroom at 7.30pm.

## 1. Apologies for Absence

Apologies for Absence had been received from Cllr. Martin Foley (ECC)

## 2. Public Representations

Mr. Stuart Hastie, Treasurer of the Village Hall Committee said that he had been nominated to attend the meeting by his committee to put their views on the proposed plans for the renewal/refurbishment of the disabled toilet at the village hall. It was the Committee's view that the small hall should be used for storage and that the existing disabled toilet in the listed part of the building should be refurbished.

Members would take these views into consideration when making their decisions.

## 3. Short address by Cllr. Martin Foley on County Council matters

Cllr. Foley had tended his apologies due to having contracted Covid.

## 4. Short address by Cllr. James De Vries on District Council Matters.

There was no report from Councillor DeVries in his absence.

## 5. Declaration of Interests

There were no "Declarations of Interest"

## 6. Minutes.

**Resolved** - that the Minutes of the meeting held on the 12th December 2022, previously circulated, be approved (Cllr. Smith)

## 7. Matters Arising.

- i. Playing Fields.
  - a. Rectory Lane. The playing field and equipment were in good order. The new goal nets had been put up. It was noted that ground conditions were extremely wet.
  - b. All Saints Playing Field. The Chairman had not yet received a date for the proposed meeting with the District Council to discuss the future of the land at adjacent to All Saints Close. It was noted that, as the lease had now expired, the responsibility for the upkeep of the equipment and land had reverted to the District Council. The upkeep of the land and the

equipment was one of the items to be discussed at the proposed meeting. It was noted that the land was extremely wet due to the clay sub soil and the recent rain.

- ii Highways. Traffic Management.
  - a. Spriggs Lane. Nothing to report
  - b. Spoil Butlers Lane/Byrds Farm. Nothing to report.
  - c. Speeding. Radwinter Road Flooding and Road Gullies

Councillor Smith reported that the Local Highways Panel would meet on Monday 16th January. He would attend.

Councillor Moran reported that he would attend the next full meeting of Essex County Council when he would put the case for Ashdon to be prioritised on the list for the introduction of a 20mph limit. He proposed the limit would cover all entrances to the village from the existing 30mph signs at Walden Road, Hill Farm, Radwinter Road, New Road Hill on the Camps Road and the bridge at Knox End. Steventon End would need to be given careful consideration as to what limit could be introduced and enforced.

The Chairman was concerned at the lack of speed restriction signs in the village and suggested that, in the absence of action by Highways, the Parish Council might consider purchasing flashing speed signs from their own budget.

It was noted that, following recent rains, many of the gullies in Radwinter Road were blocked again due to debris being washed down and the inadequacies of the current drains to take the water flow. It had been particularly bad from the entrance to the development in Radwinter Road to Crown Hill caused by dirty run off from the site. It was noted that there were no interceptor drains to prevent run off from the site. Councillor Foley was pursuing this matter and flooding in general with Highways and had requested a site visit by the CEO of the County Council.

iii. Village Hall and White Horse House.

## Resolved - that:-

- i. The existing disabled toilets be refurbished to the required standard;
- ii. the sanitary ware in the remaining two toilets be removed;
- iii. a new storage cupboard for the bowls trolley/equipment be installed in the old hall as per the architect's plan;
- iv. that the old hall be used for storage for the long table trolley;
- v. that the door frame between the old hall and passageway be re-designed to afford improved wheel chair access to the refurbished toilets. (Cllr Moran)

The Chairman had previously reported that the electrical distribution box in White Horse House may need replacing to meet the latest standard. Elliott's Electrical of Saffron Walden to advise.

iv. To receive an update on the Neighbourhood Plan.

Councillor Moran reported that in recent discussions with councillors from other villages they had commented on how good the Ashdon Neighbourhood Plan was.

v. Community Led Housing.

A meeting was being organised with the Interim Head of Housing at the District Council. Date to be advised. See Item 7ib.

vi. Neighbourhood Watch.

Councillor Mrs. Lee reported that she would be meeting Mr. Gifford, UDC Coordinator next week.

- viii. Commemoration of the Centenary of Ashdon Meteorite 9th March 2023.

Plans were well in hand for March.

Councillor Mrs. Lee reported that plans were well in hand. A meeting would be held am Tuesday 10th January. Action to date:- School Playing Field booked (also hope to use the toilets), First Aiders booked, Children's' Entertainer booked. Advertising banners, leaflets etc being investigated. Gazebo's required. Noted that the budget be increased to £3,000.00
